The Lost

O holy One, by the power of your Holy Spirit at work in the word read and proclaimed, may the words of our mouths and the meditations of our hearts be acceptable to you, our Rock and Redeemer. Amen.

Our reading in Luke shares a familiar parable, which follows two other parables about loss. In the first parable, a shepherd of 100 sheep noticed one missing and went in search of it. In the second, a woman with ten coins noticed one was lost and celebrated when it was found. In each of these parables they noticed the missing, went seeking and found it. The parable today is often referred to as the parable of the prodigal son. The term prodigal can be defined as reckless and extravagant or it can be giving something on a lavish scale. The young son can be described as reckless while the father gives on a lavish scale.

Perhaps in it's naming the parable lost a piece of its intended meaning. Could the parable also be understand from the perspective of "A Man Had Two Sons." This title may bring to mind the stories of Cain and Abel, Ishmael and Isaac, Esau and Jacob. In their stories, you may recall the focus tended to be on the younger brother. In Luke, the focus remains the younger son for much of the parable. Yet, the story is about much more. After leaving the family and squandering his early inheritance, the younger son experienced a moment of clarity and realized something was not as it should be. After he hit rock bottom he made his way home. This lost son returned hungry and destitute. His father heard of his return and, filled with compassion, ran to embrace him. The father interrupted the son's planned speech. Regardless of what he had done, he was still his father's son. "My son was dead, and is alive again; he was lost, and is found!" The father was overwhelmed with joy when the young man safely returned home. And the parable continued with an extravagant feast to celebrate. But, the oldest son was somehow not told of the celebration. When the oldest returned from work he discovered his brother's return and the lavish party and he was upset. The oldest felt disconnected from his father and neglected.

The father had two sons and it seems he didn't realize that he had lost the older son. Perhaps in this parable Jesus is urging us to be mindful of who is counted and who is not. Have we recognized the need to include care for others? Each week we hear of the mission moment which provides a very brief update on the efforts of PWS&D and Presbyterian Sharing. This brief update allows a glimpse into the immense efforts of caring for those in need. The scriptures teach that we live in a world filled with the abundance of God's provision and grace.

In God Has a Dream, Archbishop Desmond Tutu writes: "I have a dream, God says. Please help Me to realize it. It is a dream of a world whose ugliness and squalor and poverty, its war and hostility, its greed and harsh competitiveness, its alienation and disharmony are changed into their glorious counterparts, when there will be more laughter, joy, and peace, where there will be justice and goodness and compassion and love and caring and sharing. I have a dream that swords will be beaten into plowshares and spears into pruning hooks, that My children will know that they are members of one family, the human family, God's family, My family."
