In the midst of change there can be a great deal of confusion. Most of us are familiar with confusion – we hear or read conflicting information from various sources which can lead to uncertainty. The vast amount of available information includes some that may not be accurate. In a recent conversation with my youngest son ... we had the opportunity to talk about his schoolwork. Of all things, we discussed statistics. He had taken a stats course and he was intrigued by the ways in which the data could be manipulated. Data can be mis-shaped to create a false perception. In a similar way ... details in stories can be mis-shaped. It is our work to sift through the stories and the data to determine where the truth sits. It is helpful to start with a premise – which can be challenging when we feel confused. Some basics to ask include.. Do we trust the source of information? Does it

seem to fit within the framework of our understanding? Do we have the necessary information?

In reading the Gospel this morning it is important to place it within its context. We are familiar with the scene of the last supper. We hold the main story of the Passover. Sometimes we lose track of the details that differ in the gospels. They are accounts from diverse perspectives so it makes sense that the unfolding stories would differ in the particulars. The passage from John's gospel today is taking place during the Passover. When Jesus was preparing for his death, and preparing the disciples, he was gentle with them. You may recall that during the supper, Jesus rose from the table to wash the feet of the disciples, drying them with the towel around his waist. When Jesus finished, the disciples were told, "You call me Teacher and Lord-and you are right, for that is what I am. So if I ... your Lord and Teacher, have washed your feet, you also ought to wash one another's feet. For I have set you an example, that you also should do as I have done to you." Then, Jesus told Judas to do what he intended and Judas left the room to gather the guards.

This is where we came into the story today. Jesus spoke again to the disciples, "The hour has come for the Son of Man to be glorified. Very truly, I tell you, unless a grain of wheat falls into the earth and dies, it remains just a single grain; but if it dies, it bears much fruit" <sup>3</sup>

The glory, the passion of Christ. Jesus referred to the events that were about to unfold and culminate in his crucifixion. John's Gospel provides two perspectives—the ministry of Jesus as it unfolds and the concerns of the communities around him.

In the midst of this portion of the supper, Jesus bult on the teaching that we are to care for one another when he said, "I give you a new commandment, that you love one another. Just as I have loved you, you also should love one another". Amy Jill Levine reminds us that this teaching "is not "new" in the sense of original: Leviticus 19:18, 34 enjoins love of one's fellow and of the stranger... It is a part of the new life to which the disciples are invited." We are to love one another to embody the truth that Christ

reveals. This embodied love is revealed through us in all that we do and say to one another.

This 'love command' is at the center and the underlying premise of the ways of Jesus. It seems a simple teaching, "Just as I have loved you, you also should love one another." Cyril of Alexandria, Augustine, and others noted that Leviticus 19:18 essentially commanded Israel to "love your neighbor as yourself." What was new? Augustine suggested the difference was found in the spiritual love. The Spirit moves us to be in connection with one another.

This teaching underlines the events in our reading from the book of Acts. Peter spoke of the vision he received while praying. He saw a sheet being lowered from heaven with a variety of creatures on it. He was told to "kill and eat." Peter refused because the food was "profane" and "unclean." Then he heard the crucial line, "What God has made clean, you must not call profane". Then three men from Caesarea appeared at the door. The Spirit told Peter to go with them and not distinguish between "them and us". Peter then preached at the home of Cornelius and the Holy Spirit fell upon them. Peter asked the profound question, "Who was I that I could hinder God?".

Peter was able to shift his understanding with the help of God's Spirit. He was open to the ways in which God was at work in the world and realized the Creator did not exclude anyone. Peter discerned the connection between his vision and the three visitors who asked him to travel to Caesarea with them. He was open to God's healing and reconciling Spirit. When the leaders in Jerusalem heard his account, they were moved by the Spirit as they listened to the new reality Peter experienced.

The love command forms the premise and structure of our faith. We are to love God with all our heart, soul, and mind and love our neighbours as ourselves. The Spirit nudges us to reach out to others and be in community. To be with one another in Christ's love. In closing, Peter's story spoke of how God intervened in a vision. A voice called to Peter to see his mission in broader terms. Stephen D Jones wrote, "Peter's message was, "This is my story, but it could as easily have been your story. This could have happened to you. What would you have done, if God had appeared and spoken to you in this way? Would you, could you, have acted differently?" Praise be to God.
