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Readings & Questions for Reflection

Jan 15th Isaiah 49:1–7; Psalm 40:1–11; 1Cor 1:1–9; John 1:29–42

Peter's life was changed forever when his brother Andrew invited him to meet Jesus. How are you attentive to those who might be seeking Jesus? Do you trust God to give you gifts for sharing the story of your salvation? How do you embody God's love?

Jan 22nd Isaiah 9:1–4; Psalm 27:1, 4–9; 1Cor 1:10–18; Matthew 4:12–23

What does Jesus mean when he calls us to be "fishers of people"? What must you leave behind to be a faithful disciple of Jesus?

Jan 29th Micah 6:1–8; Psalm 15; 1 Cor 1:18–31; Matthew 5:1–12

How do we live in hope of a reality we cannot yet see or, at best, catch only fleeting glimpses? Where in your life of prayer and service do you see God's justice, peace, and healing? Do you ask, Where am I being called to do justice, love mercy, and walk humbly in each day?

God calls the church to seek God's justice in the world. All the church says, does, and is silent on stands as a public witness to how the body of Christ lives and acts, and what it desires for the world. The church properly uses its voice to call on elected officials to help shape a world where all creation, including humans, may flourish.
