Journeys

O holy One, by the power of your Holy Spirit at work in the word read and proclaimed, may the words of our mouths and the meditations of our hearts be acceptable to you. Amen.

When we travel through the stories in scripture each week it may be helpful to see the people, as complex individuals. It can be tempting to oversimplify them as heroes or villains. Rather, it is helpful to be mindful of their journeys in faith that encompass the spiritual with the physical and relational. When we do so, we are able to learn from their courageous journeys. The journeys of Abram, Sarai, and Nicodemus. When we share our journeys with each other we are able to grow and be transformed in our faith.

Jesus speaks of transformation in John's gospel as he describes re-birth as a new way of knowing and experiencing the divine and the world. When this happens, he says, it will be as though we have begun life all over again. Jesus told Nicodemus, and continues to tell us, that God's kingdom is here. The kingdom of God is not a far-off destination ... it is here now as a gift from God. It is a new way of being, a new way of seeing, hearing, and living. But, first we look to the re-birth Abram and Sarai experienced with their call in

Genesis 12:1-4 [B#10/W#10]

This is the beginning of the story that introduces generations of people to the patriarch of three faith traditions -Judaism, Islam, and Christianity.

These few verses from Genesis form the bridge between the primal history and the story of Israel's earliest ancestors. Through the call and promise to Abram and Sarai, a crucial claim is made about the relationship between God and humanity. God wants to be in relationship with us.

Before we look at Abram's story, we can look a little further back. A great history is revealed in the first 11 chapters of Genesis. God made all of creation and then people were tempted to become like God. In shame they first hid from God and then they were sent from the garden. Their children became adults and one killed the other. Cain was sent out of his community to live east of Eden and his family grew. The genealogy in Chapters 10 and 11 leads into the story of Noah and the flood. Again and again, people persistently pivot away from God and God mourns their choice. Curse and punishment did not change human behaviour and God promised to never to respond in such a way again. Once the flood cleared, the family continued to journey throughout the region. Eventually, the people determined that they had the technology to build a tower to reach God. The tower of Babel tells how they tried to claim a place among the divine. Scripture tells of their journeys through the lineage from Adam to Noah to Shem to Terah to Abram. The stories are an account of the many families and how they moved further and further east from Eden as they pivot away from God.

Abram had two brothers, one died in Ur of the Chaldeans and left a son named Lot. We met up with Abram in our reading. He is 75 years old and God is telling him to leave the clan that he belonged to. He was told to leave and go where he has never been. To leave his kin, his home, to leave all that he knew. God would guide his way and protect him. It was a time when the expectation held that you would live the life of your ancestors and follow the traditions of your family... yet, Abram- at the age of 75 - took his wife and his nephew and all that they owned to begin the journey into the unknown.

In our time, we know it is common for people to leave their family and their community to go out into the world. Our neighbours may be from different cities and different countries, from diverse faith communities, from diverse educational and cultural backgrounds. In our churches and congregations we know the experience of God calling. It is not always the best qualified or trained individuals who are called into service. We witness many who are led by their faith and in that faith, God prepares them to fulfill their purpose. The expression that comes to mind is that God doesn't call the qualified... God qualifies the called. It is our faithful response to God's leading that we are blessed with gifts and talents, and with acquired skills.

Yesterday we were able to hear more about the faithful journey of Ruth Talbot from her family and the Rev Dr Stephen Farris. Ruth lived out her faith as a good and faithful servant of God with her family, her church, and her neighbours. She was an integral part of this congregation for 78 years as she shared her gifts of leadership, hospitality, and warm humour. She responded to God's call on her life by sharing her love of God and scripture with people. God called and she responded.

God called and Abram responded. This story tells of Abram, Sarai, and Lot's willingness to embrace a new way of being. Their faith in action when they step out into the unknown. Their trust was rooted in the belief that God would guide them on their journey. They were not perfect in their choices or actions, and ... they continued to try. Their faith wavered at times, yet they would pivot back to God. In their faithfulness, new nations were born. Their story helps us to recognize them as flawed people who courageously struggled in their faith journey.

The struggles continue throughout the centuries. The gospel of John tells of Nicodemus, a Pharisee and a member of the Sanhedrin, who joined Jesus in Jerusalem during the Passover feast. Nicodemus was curious about Jesus but unable to seek him out in the light of day.

John 3:1-17 [B#93/W#96]

Nicodemus reminds us that many search for understanding. He was able to persist with this difficult conversation with Jesus as he struggled with the teaching, both literally and figuratively. Their conversation helps us to pause and consider a new perspective on our own faith. It is in the journey, in the action of doing what is true. In John's Gospel believing and doing are linked.

We know a few details about their encounter. Perhaps Nicodemus went to Jesus in the night so he could keep his faith secret, separate from the rest of his life. He recognized that Jesus could only do the signs if God was with him. When Jesus told Nicodemus that he must be born again by water and Spirit, he was instructing Nicodemus to let God work in his life. The invitation to Nicodemus, and to us, encourages a shift in our imaginations and calls us to re-consider our relationship with God. Jesus invites us to come into the light of day and become full participants in the abundant life he offers. We cannot do this on our own. It is God who will give birth in water and Spirit.

God continues to call to us ... to be attentive to God's call on our lives. How will we respond? Stories in scripture help us to see how God chooses to remain in relationship with us. We are called to be with God and with one another in this journey of faith. Praise be to God for visions and the movement of the Spirit among us.
