JUNE MISSION FOCUS

Throughout the month of June, Knox Presbyterian Church Bayfield will be collecting children's books and school supplies to support the efforts of the Rotary Club of Grand Bend Education & Youth Services Committee. Since 2010, the Rotary Club of Grand Bend has partnered with other Rotary Clubs across Southwestern Ontario shipping almost 100, 40' shipping containers loaded with school furniture, blackboards, books and school supplies to developing countries such as South Africa and Eswatini. The containers are then received by Rotary Clubs in those countries, and are unloaded and distributed to rural schools.

There is a big need for basic supplies, such as: pencils, pens, crayons, pencil crayons, sharpeners, rulers, scissors, markers, paper, scribblers or exercise notebooks, erasers, glue or glue sticks, construction paper, and art supplies. Also requested are teacher aids such as: flash cards, stickers, learning games, tape, and used & new books to assist the children with their reading skills. Toothpaste and toothbrushes gladly welcomed as well.
